MICHAEL LYKLOUDIS

The Francis and Kathleen Rooney Dean of the School of Architecture, Dean Michael Lykoudis has served as professor of architecture at the University of Notre Dame since 1991. Prior to becoming Dean, he served for over ten years as the Director of Undergraduate Studies, then as Associate Chair. He established several new initiatives within the School of Architecture, and was the principal organizer of the new classical and urban curriculum. For the 2000-2001 academic year Dean Lykoudis received Notre Dame's Kaneb Award for outstanding undergraduate teaching. He has lectured at universities around the country and abroad as well as to professional and civic organizations.

A graduate of Cornell University, Dean Lykoudis earned his Master's degree from the University of Illinois' joint business administration and architecture program. Prior to joining the Notre Dame faculty, he worked as a project designer and architect for firms in Florida, Greece, Connecticut and New York. He has directed his own practice since 1983 in Athens, and Stamford, Connecticut, and now in South Bend, Indiana.

Dean Lykoudis is the co-editor of two publications, *Building Cities*, published in 1999 by Artmedia Press, and "The Other Modern" exhibition catalogue published in 2000 by Dogma Press. His third book, *Modernity, Modernism and the Other Modern*, is forthcoming from W.W. Norton & Company.

Founded in 1964, the Cincinnati Preservation Association (*formerly known as the Miami Purchase Association for Historic Preservation*) is a non-profit organization dedicated to advocacy and education for the preservation of historic resources in the Greater Cincinnati area.
