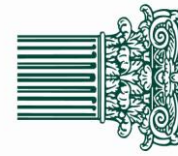

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Our History

The Cincinnatus Association was formed in 1920, when Cincinnati attorney Victor Heintz assembled a group of business leaders to address corruption, waste and ineffectiveness in Cincinnati government. This group focused on resolution of the issues through study, consideration, and public information and stimulation.

In the 85 years since, the Association, with its influential, informed and activist membership, has continued to identify, assess and address significant issues affecting the quality of life in Cincinnati.

Lucius Quinctius Cincinnatus

In 458 BC, the Roman Empire was threatened by an army of barbarian tribes. The Senate called upon Lucius Cincinnatus, a Roman general who had retired to farming, granting him the powers of dictator so he could save the nation. Upon accomplishing this task in only 16 days, Cincinnatus relinquished his powers and returned to his farm.

To this day, Cincinnatus is revered as a model leader and citizen – a man who neither sought power nor held onto it once he had met the needs of his people.

Our Service

The Cincinnatus Association is composed of over 150 community leaders committed to initiating, participating in and promoting projects that **improve the quality of life for the citizens in Greater Cincinnati.**

Efforts of the Cincinnatus Association are coordinated and attributed to our Panels, each delegated a specific area of the Association's overall mission:

- **Arts & Culture** – improvement and support of arts and cultural organizations and opportunities in Greater Cincinnati.
